Colorado legislators reaffirm commitment to organ, eve and tissue donation

n April 23, 2012, the Colorado **General Assembly** recognized Donor Alliance for its contributions to the promotion of organ and tissue donation in Colorado. Members of Donor Alliance's leadership team, Governing Board of Directors and community partners accepted the resolution, sponsored by Senator Lucia Guzman (D-Denver), Senator Jean White (R-Hayden), Representative Dan Pabon (D-Denver) and Representative Carole Murray (R-Castle Rock). The recognition was timed in conjunction with National Donate Life Month, which honors the generosity of organ, eye and tissue donors and their families

and commemorates all transplant recipients in the United States.

In the resolution, Donor Alliance was lauded for recovering a record

number of organ donors in 2011, enabling 52 more people to receive lifesaving transplants than in 2010. Additionally, last year Donor Alliance worked with 966 tissue donors and their families to recover lifesaving and healing tissue, providing bone and skin grafts that will impact thousands.

"It is an incredible honor and a very moving tribute to everyone whose life has been touched by donation for Donor Alliance to receive this recognition from the Colorado Senate and House of Representatives," said Sue Dunn, president and CEO of Donor Alliance.

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Donor Alliance is the federally-designated, Association of Organ Procurement Organizations (AOPO) and American Association of Tissue Banks (AATB) accredited, non-profit organ procurement organization serving Colorado and most of Wyoming. As a recognized leader in facilitating the donation and recovery of transplantable organs and tissues, Donor Alliance's mission is to save lives through organ and tissue donation and transplantation. To achieve this mission, Donor Alliance employs effective family approach and recovery programs in more than 100 hospitals. Donor Alliance also inspires the public to register as organ and tissue donors through community partnerships, public outreach and education campaigns throughout its donation service area.

n April 2012, during National Donate Life Month, Donor Alliance celebrated a remarkable achievement since the opening of its new recovery center in June of 2011.

The first organ recovery was performed.

This new state of the art recovery center signals a change for Colorado and its four transplant centers. It allows

organ recoveries from brain dead donors, which normally occur at Colorado and Wyoming hospitals, to take place at the new facility in Lowry. This is beneficial not just for Donor Alliance, but also for area hospitals whose intensive care units and operating rooms will gain capacity for waiting patients.

"Building this facility, and the detail and thought that goes into a project of this scale, has been a remarkable experience for us at Donor Alliance," said Sue Dunn. "Working with partners and the community at large to bring this to completion has equipped us to better serve each organ and tissue donor family with the best service to be able to honor their loved one's gift."

Donor Alliance's recovery center is equipped with an ambulance bay, a two-bed donor care unit, three state-of-the-art operating rooms – one for tissue recovery, one for organ recovery and one alternate – and plenty of supplies. A comfortable

waiting area is also available for families.

Donor Alliance's employees have been energized with this new addition and continue to seek ways to improve day to day operations. Three other organ procurement organizations have built their own

built their own facilities; most notably Mid-America Transplant Services in





St. Louis, which has conducted some 1,000 organ cases since opening a decade ago.

new Web site in March 2012, inviting Colorado and Wyoming donor families, recipients, staff, community and stakeholders to come experience donation as never before.



The 2012 Donate Life Rose Parade Float

onor Alliance celebrated its seventh year as an official sponsor of the Donate Life Rose Parade float campaign, spearheaded by OneLegacy, the organ procurement organization serving the greater Los Angeles area. The 123rd Rose Parade, themed Just Imagine, took place January 2, 2012. The One More Day float, inspired by floral clocks and clock towers from around the world, featured six enormous floral timepieces adorned with 72 memorial floragraphs (floral portraits) of deceased donors whose gifts gave life and time to so many.

A rose dedication garden honored more than 3,000 people worldwide; each rose bore a personal message of love and remembrance, while the garden's clock hand turned backwards in a nod to the thousands of memorial dedications. Anchoring the float was


a 33-foot clock tower with a rotating sun/moon dial reminding us to make each passing day count.






Celebrating National Donate Life Month



Two types of organ donation allow patients to directly help those awaiting a lifesaving transplant:

Organ Donation after Brain Death

Brain death is declared following irreversible cessation of all brain function. Brain death occurs in about 1 out of every 100 hospital deaths. The majority of organ donations occur after persons are declared brain dead.

Organ Donation after Circulatory Death

Circulatory death is declared when circulation is no longer detectable. Donation after Circulatory Death (DCD) may be an option for families of patients who have a severe neurological injury or irreversible brain damage. DCD patients do not meet brain death criteria and require ventilator support to sustain life. After the patient's physician has determined that the patient has no chance for recovery and the family has decided to withdraw support, the DCD option allows families to honor their loved one's wish to be an organ donor. It may also be an option when patients themselves no longer wish to be maintained on life support with conditions such as ALS or high cervical fractures.
