



What You Need to Know for National Donate Life Month:

#ShineALight for National Donate Life Month this April! National Donate Life Month honors the generosity of organ, eye and tissue donors and their families and commemorates all transplant recipients in the United States throughout the month of April. Join in and help us raise awareness of the importance of registering as a donor and to acknowledge around 1,500 Coloradans who await lifesaving transplants across our region.

Suggested Sample Questions and Talking Points:

- What events and celebrations are planned in our area for National Donate Life Month?
 - #ShineALight for National Donate Life Month April 1-30:
 - April 1-30, 2022, #ShineALight for National Donate Life Month by joining us to illuminate the need to register and say yes to organ, eye and tissue donation. All you have to do is:

 - 2.) **UPLOAD** your photo of your light display or **SHARE** on social so your friends can see.
 - National Blue & Green Day April 22, 2022:
 - On Friday, April 22nd, supporters of organ, eye and tissue donation across the United States will celebrate National Blue & Green Day as part of National Donate Life Month! Celebrate by wearing blue and green to spread awareness and show your support. Don't forget to snap a picture and share it on social media using #ShineALight as 1,500 residents in our region await a lifesaving transplant. - Do a lot of Wyomingites sign up to be a donor? Where do we stack up compared to other states?

Wyomingites are incredibly generous and right now, we have the 4th highest donor designation rate in the USA with 61% of Wyomingites signed up as organ, eye and tissue donors. However, as long as there is still around 1,500 awaiting lifesaving transplants, our work is not done, and we continue to encourage all residents to consider signing up to be a donor and give the gift of life.

Additional conversational tips:

- We've all heard myths surround organ & tissue donation. Can you help us sort out the facts?
 - **a.** All major religions support organ, eye and tissue donation and see it as an act of love and generosity toward others.
 - **b.** The first priority of any medical professional is to save lives when sick or injured people come to the hospital Donation is not an option until death has been declared.
 - **c.** There is no cost to the donor or their family for organ, eye & tissue donation.





• Who can sign up to be a donor? What is the age limit? What about disease?

ANYONE can sign up to be an organ, eye and tissue donor regardless of age, race, or medical history! Each person's medical condition is evaluated at the time of their death to determine what organs and tissues are viable for donation. People with chronic diseases or those who have a history of cancer or other serious diseases are still encouraged to sign up as organ, eye and tissue donors and may still be viable to be donors. Sign up today and let the medical professionals decide!

How many lives can be saved from one donor?

Eight lives can be saved from a single organ donor and more than 75 lives can be saved and healed through the donation of tissue, like skin for burn victims and bone for reconstruction.

What organs can be transplanted? Tissues?

Organs that can be donated by signing up include the heart, liver, lungs, kidneys, pancreas and small intestine (eight transplantable organs total). Tissues that can be donated include bones, skin, tendons, heart valves, veins and corneas.
