

WHEREAS, National Donate Life Month raises awareness about organ, eye, and tissue donation, encourages Americans to register as donors, and honors those that have saved lives through the gift of donation; and

WHEREAS, Colorado has the nation's highest-performing state donor registry with 67% of driver license/ID card applicants signing up to be organ and tissue donors — a decision that reflects deep commitment to one another; and

WHEREAS, one donor can save up to 8 lives through organ donation and save and heal more than 75 lives through tissue donation: and

WHEREAS, Donor Alliance completed a record 234 organ donations and 642 life-saving transplants occurred in 2021; and

WHEREAS, there was an 8.8% increase in organ donors and 3.3% increase in life saving transplants in 2021 compared to 2020 in Colorado and Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, Donor Alliance recovered tissue for transplant from 2,082 donors in 2021; and

WHEREAS, nearly 1,500 people are waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant in Colorado and Wyoming, and of those, many are waiting for a kidney and 156 are waiting for a liver; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the U.S. officially surpassed 40,000 transplants in one year, a historic first for the nation; and

WHEREAS, Donor Alliance's Donor Service Area includes almost 6 million residents and covers 184,151 square miles, including all of Colorado and most of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, between 2016 and 2021 fatalities of those on the Colorado organ transplant waitlist decreased by 56%; and

WHEREAS, organ and tissue donation is made possible by the Donor Alliance in Colorado and Wyoming and all organ procurement organizations across America;

THEREFORE, I, Jared Polis, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2022 as
