

The Donor Alliance Foundation's mission is to build partnerships and break down barriers to influence change that will positively affect the donation and transplant community.

Family Assistance Program Area

Created in December 1993 as a nonprofit 501c3 and re-established in August 2017, it operates exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes as a supporting organization to Donor Alliance.

The Donor Alliance Foundation funds education, family assistance and research efforts of nonprofit organizations working in the field of organ and tissue donation and transplantation in Colorado and Wyoming.

Family Assistance

Grants will include funding to:

- › Provide grief assistance and compassion support for donor families through nonprofit community health-serving organizations; other nonprofit organizations doing work with donation and transplantation
- › Meet the needs of people or families who are waiting for a transplant, or who are post transplant, by providing food vouchers, housing and medication assistance
- › Meet the needs of living donors and potential living donors by providing food vouchers and housing assistance

General Grantmaking Criteria

Projects should:

- › Align with The Donor Alliance Foundation's mission to build partnerships, break down barriers and positively affect the donation and transplant community
- › Be located Colorado or Wyoming
- › Be submitted from nonprofit organizations (individuals are not qualified to apply)
- › Demonstrate positive impact and measurable outcomes. Make a difference in the community, not just for the organizations applying

Program Specific Criteria

Applications should:

- › Be submitted through viable nonprofit, community serving, social work or hospital-based program and be able to demonstrate how their services directly meet the need of the population they serve
- › Show a direct and immediate impact to those served
- › Be able to measure and effectively report uses of funding and the benefit to recipients

The Foundation will award up to \$175,000 during the first grant cycle from September 1, 2018 - August 31, 2019.

- ✓ Nonprofit community health-serving organizations
- ✓ Colorado and Wyoming hospitals
- ✓ Universities and medical schools
- ✓ Foundations
- ✓ Transplant centers
- ✓ Nonprofit organizations doing work in donation and transplantation

- 1 Applications due by 5 p.m. MDT on Monday, July 16, 2018
- 2 Potential site visits between July 23 - August 17, 2018
- 3 All applicants notified in August 2018
