

**The Donor Alliance Foundation's mission is to build partnerships and break down barriers to influence change that will positively affect the donation and transplant community.**

## Education Program Area

Created in December 1993 as a nonprofit 501c3 and re-established in August 2017, it operates exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes as a supporting organization to Donor Alliance.

The Donor Alliance Foundation funds education, family assistance and research efforts of nonprofit organizations working in the field of organ and tissue donation and transplantation in Colorado and Wyoming.

### Education

#### Grants will include:

- › Funding for education on donation and transplantation through hospitals, governmental agencies and community health-serving organizations
- › Scholarships for students studying in the areas of donation and transplantation (i.e., nursing, medical, mortuary science and master-level social work students)

### Grantmaking Criteria

#### Projects should:

- › Align with The Donor Alliance Foundation's mission to build partnerships, break down barriers and positively affect the donation and transplant community
- › Be located in Colorado or Wyoming
- › Be submitted from nonprofit organizations (individuals are not qualified to apply)
- › Demonstrate positive impact and measurable outcomes. Make a difference in the community, not just for the organizations applying

### Education Program Specific Grant Criteria

#### Applicants should:

- › Demonstrate how they meet the overall criteria and plan to demonstrate programs and interventions that reach in-need populations being served through community health centers
- › Measure and effectively report progress and plans post-funding
- › Provide appropriate documentation of coursework at institution and future plans in the field of donation and transplantation (For scholarship applicants, funding will be awarded to the instant on the student's behalf)

**The Foundation will award up to \$175,000 during the first grant cycle from September 1, 2018 - August 31, 2019.**

- ✓ Nonprofit community health-serving organizations
- ✓ Colorado and Wyoming hospitals
- ✓ Universities and medical schools
- ✓ Foundations
- ✓ Transplant centers
- ✓ Nonprofit organizations doing work in donation and transplantation

- 1 Applications due by 5 p.m. MDT on Monday, July 16, 2018
- 2 Potential site visits between July 23 - August 17, 2018
- 3 All applicants notified in August 2018
